Dear Parents/Guardians, Students & Friends of SFX

Easter is nearly here. The year is marching on and the first school term is almost complete. Year 12 will be sitting their mid-course exams and Year 11 have nearly completed a seventh of their senior studies.

The first school term has seen events like; the Commissioning Ceremony, Orientation Days, the 'Get-to-know-you Day', information evenings, music presentations, various social justice events, a number of sporting fixtures and the 'Battle of the Bands' contest. All this is in addition to our core business of teaching and learning. This is the reality of life at SFX at this time of the year.

No doubt the life of most parents would echo similar amounts of intensity.

So when Easter does arrive it may be opportune to stop and breathe a little. As the saying goes, 'remember to stop and smell the roses.' And it may be worthwhile to take in some of the powerful messages from the Easter story that still have relevance in our daily lives.

Perhaps the strongest message is that of the crucifixion. This is symbolised in Christian churches throughout the world by the cross. Immediately, as you walk into a church you are confronted with a cross. Right at the front, and it remains in your view the whole time that you are in the church.

This cross reminds us of several pillars of our faith. Strong among those is that suffering and pain is part of what we believe and are part of our lives. They have always been part of the human condition and will always remain part of it. Christianity accepts this and acknowledges that we cannot hide from the pain that we will confront.

Unfortunately some people do try to avoid pain by resorting to various means of escape. Drugs, alcohol, bullying and violence can all be unhealthy attempts to escape the reality of life. They rarely provide long-term solutions and can frequently lead to further pain for themselves or other people, especially loved ones.

It is also worth remembering that at the foot of that cross at Calvary stood a man's mother and friend. He was not alone as he endured great humiliation, physical pain and agonising death. He was comforted and supported by those who loved him and this is how we know about what it is to have hope.

This is the most powerful message of the Easter season. It is that hope will triumph over pain and that when we support, comfort and love others we are helping people to have hope and see worth in their lives.

I extend to all families of the College a happy and blessed Easter season.

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING (VET)

Port Waratah Scholarships Report

PWCS in partnership with the Department of

Education and Training and the Catholic Schools Office has established a two year Vocation, Education and Training (VET) scholarship for students in Years 11 and 12 in Business Services and Metals & Engineering. Twelve scholarships are offered each year each valued at \$4,200 over the two years. A requirement of the scholarship is that students undertake study in VET Business Services or Metals & Engineering. The Business Services students complete a Certificate II in Business Services at SFX whilst Metals & Engineering students complete a Certificate II in Metals & Engineering at Hunter TAFE. The program allows students to combine their studies with on the job training at PWCS by way of Work Placement which assists in their development and enables them to gain experience in the workplace in these Industry areas. Life Skills First Aid Training

On Friday, 14 March Year 11 and Year 12 Life Skills students participated in a First Aid training day as part of a final assessment for the First Aid Preliminary Certificate course studied this term in their Work and the Community module.

Both the First Aid Assessment Day and course was run by the Work and Community teacher, Mrs Sharon Unie, Dee Conroy, a Transition Support Worker from Youth Connections and Surf Life Saving First AID trainer, Greg King.

Throughout the First Aid training day students learnt different ways to perform CPR on both adults and infants. The practical skills we learned were: how to recognise and check for a pulse; how to put a person in the recovery position; how to bandage wounds and how to use a defibrillator. We were then assessed on how we performed CPR on the first aid mannequins.

The final part of the training day was the written assessment. Throughout the last four weeks of term we had studied the principles of first aid such as ratio of compressions to breaths;

emergency numbers to call when using mobile, landline or if you are hearing impaired; depth of compressions to use for CPR; and how to support and treat a person who has suffered a stroke, sunburn, hypothermia, a fall, asthma attack, swallowed poison or been bitten by a snake. The most important first aid principle we learnt was to follow the DRSABCD rule whenever we come across a situation where people are hurt and may require first aid.

Everyone enjoyed the day. Food and drinks were provided by the presenters.

Some final comments from the students were:

"It was interesting to do the CPR and learn bandaging"; "It was fun to do...lots of hands on activities"; "the mannequin's chests were hard to push 1/3 down; "I enjoyed the day and working together doing the bandaging".

We thank our teachers and presenters for this learning opportunity. We now feel more confident at helping each other in an emergency.




Thanks to the generosity of our students we have been able to give Easter Eggs to about 450 residents in local nursing homes in recent years.

Up against Aberdeen in the first game it was one sided from the tipoff with SFX controlling all aspects of the game: with noteworthy hustle from both John and Ben. However, despite our intimidating starting five (with our shortest starter standing just below six feet), the boys from Aberdeen never gave up; continuing to play their hardest until the final buzzer when the scoreboard read 46-1.

Our second game was against Booragul and with countless high-flying slam dunks from the dynamic duo of Kouat and Dhiu Noi, and some equally smooth shooting from Kaman and Michael, it was another clean sweep with the final score 58-10.

Next, rather than facing SFX Blue in the Semi Final, the draw was rearranged and we faced Singleton. Crowds gathered to watch the show, with slam-dunks and alleyoops being the order of the day. Here again we secured another resounding victory, thanks to some monster post play by Viko, and sweet touches around the rim by Reece, Myles and Nic.

Finally, came probably the most anticipated match of the day - the Grand Final against our perpetual rivals from Maitland. From the tipoff, Maitland played with determination, and displayed no sign of being intimidated by our strong record. Their confidence was amplified by a very slow start from our team. 2014 Work Experience Program at the Canberra Observatory

The Observatory offers a limited number of work experience places to students each year. These placements are typically 1 week in duration and the students work on an astronomical



project under the supervision of professional astronomers. Aside from working on their project, work experience students also learn computing skills and attend departmental talks. Subject to availability they are also usually invited to attend an evening stargazing session using the Observatory's outreach telescopes. Students outside Canberra must organise and pay for their own travel and accommodation arrangements. Students should be aware that it is highly competitive to obtain a placement and that many good students do not receive offers (students offered places typically have high level grades in maths and science). 
